Huntsville Waterworks Annual Meeting

The Huntsville Waterworks Corporation will hold its annual meeting of Shareholders (including those entitled to become Shareholders prior to the annual meeting) on Tuesday, **April 8, 2025,** at the Huntsville Town Hall, 7474 E. 200 S, Huntsville, Utah at 7:00 p.m. The order of business at the annual meeting of the Shareholders will be as follows:

- (d) Report of the President or other elected officer.
 - (e) Elections
- (f) Such other business as may be introduced by any Shareholder.

There are three positions on the Board of Trustees open for election:

- One position is for a two-year term.
- Two positions are for a three-year term.

Huntsville's Culinary Water System Update

In last month's post we mentioned that the Town will have to make decisions on how to deal with our aging culinary water infrastructure. The next step in this process will be determining the steps to take and then budgeting appropriately for the Water Fund portion of the Town budget for Fiscal 2026 to fund them. At the May Town Council meeting the Council will review the water system cost data from the past couple of years and the estimated costs for various remediation steps, to aid in the evaluation of water rates for the new fiscal year which starts July 1st. Due to numerous leaks in the first half of our fiscal year (July through December 2024) we have already spent 81% of our maintenance budget. And this did not include the costs from the Great Leak

of December 2024, which were covered out of our Water Emergency Reserve Fund. We have had several more leaks in the second half of our fiscal year and are currently still losing water from yet to be discovered leaks. Finding leaks is not easy with buried plastic piping, especially in the rocky soil sections between the treatment plant and the Town. Leaking water flows directly down into the rocky soil, leaving no surface indication of the leak. This Spring we will be utilizing sounding, electronic, and drone detection technologies with volunteers walking the transmission paths searching for any visual clues that might indicate a leak. As the data is collected, it will be shared on the forthcoming Culinary Water System information page on the Town website. If anyone notices pools of water or soggy ground areas where surface water doesn't seem to be the cause, please report it to the Town clerks. We encourage everyone to keep their eyes open for leaks, to review the data we're compiling, make comments, and become engaged.
